COMMON EXAMINATION FOR
ENTRANCE TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

SUBJECT.—**GEOGRAPHY.**

[45 minutes.]

[*N.B.—You need not do all the questions. Full marks can be obtained by GOOD answers to SOME of them. Always use sketch maps in preference to writing, where possible.*]

I. Where does nature offer the easiest journey out of central England into central Ireland? What town owes its growth to this?

Or,

In what parts of the British Isles are grown (a) most wheat, (b) most oats? In each case give reasons for what you state.

II. Where are the chief coalfields of Great Britain situated? Mention one important manufacture on each, and account for its presence.

Or,

Where is the chief manufacturing district of Ireland? What are its most important productions? Account for any of these you can.

III. Sketch an outline of South America, indicate the chief highlands, and mark and name the three most important rivers.

Or,

Sketch an outline of Africa and the position of British states in it. Name these and no others.

IV. Give as exactly as you can the position of Aden, Colombo, Hong-Kong, Karachi. How has the position of each helped to give it importance?

Or,

What do you understand by Wallace's Line, Mercator's Projection, The Great Barrier Reef, The Iron Gate, The Golden Horn?
