I. State where *three* of the following are and with what you connect them :—

Watling Street—Evesham—Orleans—Londonderry—
Torres Vedras—Zeebrugge—Cape Matapan.

II. Choose *three* of the following, taking not more than *two* from any one group ; and write not more than 4 or 5 lines on each :—

1. St. Augustine—King Stephen—The Long Bow.
2. Perkin Warbeck—King Edward VI—The Earl of Clarendon (of Charles II's time).
3. The Union of England and Scotland (1707)—The Slave Trade—The Chartists.

III. Write as interestingly as you can and as long as you have time for on *one* of the following :—

- (a) A Manor in the Middle Ages—how it was farmed, governed, etc.
- (b) What led to the Civil War of 1642 and why did Charles I lose it ?
- (c) What do you know of Sir Robert Walpole and his Ministry of 21 years : in what respects was he a good or bad Prime Minister ?
- (d) What were the causes of and the main events in *either* the Indian Mutiny *or* the Crimean War ?
