Bunker's Hill—Sebastopol—Ypres.

II. Choose *three* of the following, taking *not* more than *two* from any one group ; and write about 5 or 6 lines on each :—

1. Roman roads in England—Archbishop Anselm—
Peasant Revolt of 1381.
2. The invention of Printing and Caxton's connection
with it—Mary, Queen of Scots—the colonisation
of North America in the period of the Stuarts.
3. Causes of War of Spanish Succession — Lord
Melbourne—the chief terms of Treaty of Versailles
(1919).

III. Write as fully as you have time for on *one* of the following :—

- (a) What happened in Edward I's reign in regard to
Wales and Scotland ?
- (b) Explain the religious changes that took place in
the reigns of Henry VIII, Edward VI, and Mary.
- (c) Explain the part that Nelson took in the French
wars.
- (d) "Between about the middle of the eighteenth
century and the middle of the nineteenth century,
Great Britain became a great industrial country."
What were the chief inventions and developments
that caused this change, and what evils resulted ?
